

## Strategic Plan 2016

#### FAU's School of Urban and Regional Planning

The School of Urban and Regional Planning was founded in 1989 as the Department of Urban and Regional Planning. It currently houses three degree programs: Bachelor of Urban Design, Bachelor of Urban and Regional Planning, and Master of Urban and Regional Planning. The master's program is accredited by the Planning Accreditation Board. The School also cooperates with the School of Public Administration on a specialization in Urban and Regional Planning in the Ph.D. Program in Public Administration. It cooperates with the Department of Geosciences on the Graduate Certificate Program in Geographic Information Systems, with the Environmental Science Program on the Graduate Certificate in Environmental Restoration, and with various programs on the Graduate Certificate in Environmental Studies. The School has two research centers: the Center for Urban and Environmental Solutions (CUES) and the Visual Planning Technology (VPT) Laboratory.

#### **Strategic Planning Process**

This plan builds on the *Strategic Plan 2014* document that was the result of a retreat held in November of that year. The current plan aims to be the first in a series of annual plans that identify goals, objectives, and measures for the School as a whole as well as each of its programs and centers. Each annual update will assess achievement of the previous year's objectives based on the measures identified and will update goals and objectives for the future. It is anticipated that the strategic plan will be updated each year during the Fall semester based on accomplishments during the previous academic year. Goals and objectives are intended to implement the School's Vision and Mission as described below.

#### Vision

We aspire to cultivate future leaders and be an innovator in the creation, design, and implementation of solutions to the urban, environmental, and economic challenges of the 21<sup>st</sup> century.

#### Mission

The School of Urban and Regional Planning is committed to conducting the education, research, training, and community engagement needed to prepare planning professionals to address the urban, environmental, and economic challenges of the 21<sup>st</sup> century. This includes a focus on three specific areas:

- 1. Creating vibrant, livable, healthy, and equitable communities;
- 2. Ensuring that our communities and ecosystems are sustainable and resilient; and
- 3. Developing interdisciplinary solutions, bridging the public and private sectors, that are able to overcome the policy, fiscal, and regulatory barriers to sustainable, economically-viable development.
